

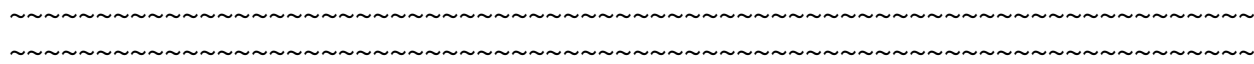


Who are the Hoosier Back Country Horsemen?
